Curriculum Overview Year 6 Autumn term

The theme for this term is...

WWII through different eyes

English

In SPaG, we are revising word classes, sentence types, clauses and conjunctions. Then we will learn about modal verbs, parenthesis and the subjunctive form. We will revise basic punctuation (capital letters, full stops and commas) and make sure that we are accurately punctuating our speech. We will ensure the consistent and correct use of tense throughout all pieces of writing. We will apply these skills to our writing, which will have pieces inspired by our topic work, such as: a missing person's report and writing as an evacuee. We will also write poems, a suspense story and a diary entry based on Macbeth. Finally, we will write a biography about Mr Frostbite.

Maths

We are starting with place value and will then move onto the four calculations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Following this, we will work on ordering and calculating with fractions, which will lead into working with decimals. We will order decimals as well as practise multiplying by 10, 100 and 1,000. Finally, we will learn about percentages, which will include looking at fraction, decimal and percentage equivalents as well as finding percentages of amounts.

Science

Electricity is our topic for this term. We will recap what we know about it and learn about the history of electricity, as well as some important figures (such as Lewis Latimer). We will complete circuit building challenges, learn how to use circuit symbols to represent components and investigate the relationship between them. Finally, we will apply what we have learned to design and build our own Morse code machines.

History

We will study WWII through the eyes of different people. We will learn how WWII started and, over the course of the unit, the children will research how the war affected the lives people in Sheffield, across Britain and in different

countries and circumstances. This, in turn, will give a wider perspective of Britain's role in world history. We will then move onto our Geography topic: Extreme Environments.

Religious Education

We will find out about the importance of creation and study Genesis 1. We will find out how different Christians may interpret this text and decide whether it is conflicting or complementary with what science says. Then we will learn about differing beliefs across the world.

Other Subjects

Computing – Word processing, safe searching and Scratch maze game

PE – Volleyball and gymnastics, followed by Netball and WWII dance

Music – Music in WWII (focus on Glenn Miller) RHE – Stereotypes, prejudice and where we get information from.

Mandarin – Mid Autumn Festival
